This booklet of prayers has been adapted for our Parish for the Month of November based on the work of the Northern Pastoral Network. We encourage you to use the booklet as part of your daily prayer during the Month of November.

You can use the booklet at home or indeed if you wish to bring the booklet with you as you visit any of the Parish Churches or Graveyards. A Plenary Indulgence can be gained for the Holy Souls by:

- Visiting the Cemetery and praying for the dead any or all days between 1st and 8th November.
- Visiting a Church or Oratory on 2nd November and reciting the Our Father and the Creed.

In all cases, one Our Father and one Hail Mary is to be said for the Pope's intentions. The usual conditions of Confessions and Holy Communion within the octave apply.

REMEMBERING OUR DECEASED LOVED ONES

Plan a time to gather in your home to pray for your deceased relatives and friends. Creating a prayer space for the Month of November can support you in your prayer.

A prayer space may include;

- A copy of your November list of the deceased, naming the people you want to pray for or names of the people you wish to pray for written on autumn leaf shapes.
- Photographs or memorial cards.
- A candle and something to light it with.
- A religious symbol such as a cross, an open Bible, a sacred picture or icon, a statue or rosary beads.
- Dim the lights of the room and quieten distractions to create a prayerful atmosphere.



- If you are gathering as a group you might choose someone to lead the different prayers or to proclaim the readings.
- You might use your phone or tablet and connect with others.
- This is your prayer time, be creative and include additional elements that will bring you and your family solace.

As we read aloud each of the names of our deceased relatives and friends let us give thanks for their lives in the stillness and quiet of our own hearts.





The names are read aloud and followed by a time of silence or reflection using the suggested music.

The time of silence and reflection is closed by everyone reading together the Alleluia. Then all gathered will be attentive to God present in his Word as a Gospel passage from St John is read;

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to John (14:1-6)



A Prayer in the Church

God's Consoling Word After each bible verse pause to let God's word speak to you Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." Response: **Your words, O Lord, are my hope and my peace.**

I Corinthians 5:1 "We know that when the tent we live in on earth is folded up, there is a house built by God for us, an everlasting home not made by human hands, in the heavens."

R. Your words, O Lord, are my hope and my peace.

John 11 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die."

You may wish to bring flowers and/or holy water for the grave or columbarium you are visiting in keeping with the customs of the resting place.

is not so great and that one day, I will be reunited with them in heaven,

God's Consoling Word After each bible verse pause to let God's word speak to you

Response: Your words, O Lord, are my hope and my peace.

Psalm 116:7-8 "Return to your rest, my soul, for the Lord has been good to you. For you, Lord, have delivered me from death."
