THE ANNUNCIATION OF OUR LORD (MONDAY 8TH APRIL)

"For the story of Jesus to be told, it needs more than God's word to be spoken, it also needs the human word to say yes. In the annunciation Luke shows us that the God who chooses Mary must wait on Mary's own response. The love that offers itself is the love that must wait. Even God has to wait for women. Even God needs permission from mothersto-be if his saving plan is to go ahead. That is why there are two annunciations: God's annunciation to Mary and Mary's annunciation to God. God's best plans can only happen when there is human co-operation,



when God's word and our word come together. When those two annunciations come together, God's word always becomes flesh."

7 April 2024 ***** Readings: B (I) ***** Psalter: Week 2




The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle used during the Easter Vigil is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time, and lit for all liturgical celebrations.

PRAYER OF TURNING TOWARD THE RISEN CHRIST

We turn to you, risen Christ, and pray:

for those whose dreams have been shattered, may they turn toward restored hope; for those who have grown weary from constant turmoil, may they turn toward peace; for those who feel disheartened, may they turn toward a spirit of encouragement; for those who have stopped believing in happiness, may they turn toward a reason to rejoice.



We turn to you, risen Christ, and pray:

for those who find little value in their work, may they turn toward fresh motivation; for those with faltering relationships, may they turn toward a disposition to love; for those whose outlook on life is bleak, may they turn toward a rekindling of joy; for those who lack self-worth, may they turn toward their imperishable goodness.

We turn to you, risen Christ, and pray:

for those who are sorrowful, may they turn toward you and find renewed gladness; for those who suffer in body, mind, or spirit, may they turn toward healing; for those in challenging transitions, may they turn toward trust in your guidance; for those who have lost their inner direction, may they turn toward home.

We turn to you, risen Christ, and pray:

for those troubled in their faith, may they turn toward confidence in your love; for those who feel burdened, may they turn toward reliance on your strength; for those seeking vengeance, may they turn toward a heartfelt desire to forgive; for those who doubt joy will ever arise, may they turn toward your resurrection.
