WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY SUN. 18TH – SUN. 25TH JANUARY 2026

The forthcoming Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, from 18th to 25th January 2026, marks this annual occasion for prayer, reflection and dialogue on the journey towards that unity which Christ himself prayed (John 17:21-23), with the theme: *'There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling'* (Ephesians 4:4).

The concept of "one body" reflects the nature of the Church. Christianity transcends cultural and national boundaries, uniting believers worldwide in faith and hope.

By living in unity, we not only witness to the love and power of our Lord Jesus Christ, but also embody the essence of His teachings. As we support one another, and celebrate our diverse gifts and talents, we reflect the heart of Christ.

Catholic Schools Week 2026

SUNDAY 18TH—SATURDAY 24TH JANUARY

Catholic schools across Ireland will celebrate Catholic Schools Week 2026 under the theme *'Catholic Schools – Normal Lives, Called to Holiness'*

Each day of Catholic Schools Week 2026 will focus on a particular aspect of everyday holiness. **Monday will explore holiness through prayer**, helping children understand prayer as a living relationship with God. **Tuesday will focus on love and friendship**, inspired by Jesus' commandment to love one another. **Wednesday**, traditionally marked as Grandparents' Day, **will celebrate family life and the role of grandparents in handing on faith** across generations. **On Thursday, schools will reflect on holiness through service and courage**, highlighting examples of self-giving love and standing up for what is right. **The week will conclude on Friday with a focus on joy and mission**, encouraging pupils to see themselves as joyful witnesses to the Gospel in the world.

Our parish primary schools will mark Grandparents' Day on Wednesday 21st, as an opportunity to thank God for the blessings that grandparents bring. Holy Family PS will hold a service in Holy Family church at 11am, and St Thérèse PS will invite grandparents to visit their grandchildren in school.

We thank the students of our local schools, who will lead us in the Offertory Procession at Masses this weekend, to mark the start of Catholic Schools Week.
